

Public Information to help residents who are homeless

Background

The County is increasingly finding people who are outside without shelter ('living rough') or spending time on the streets due to lack of safe housing. This tip sheet provides information and contacts if you meet someone you think might be homeless.

First things first:

Find out if the person needs help right now:



First Aid

1. If you encounter someone who might have overdosed on opioids (drowsy, non-responsive):

2. Call 911 and administer naloxone if you're comfortable. Naloxone will not cause any further injury. Get kits free from local pharmacies

Some things to remember about people who are homeless:

1. No one chooses to be homeless. There are many people who couch surf or live in unsafe housing which means they spend a lot of time on the street, sometimes with their belongings.
2. There are no emergency shelters or drop-ins in The County.
3. The *most* you can receive as a single person on social assistance, rent included, is \$1400. A bachelor apartment in The County costs \$1600 per month and a room \$900 per month.
4. There are very little mental health services for residents, especially youth.
5. At least half of people who are homeless have traumatic brain injury - this may affect them physically, and cause problems with speech, attention and memory. (*Lancet*, 2019)
